A GRADUATING H.S. SENIOR WHO IS A RESIDENT OR A STUDENT AT A SCHOOL IN NEW TRIER SCHOOL DISTRICT (Wilmette, Winnetka, Kenilworth, Glencoe & parts of Glenview & Northfield)

The scholarship is intended for a full-time college, university or art school student who will study applied fine arts as a major at an accredited institution of learning.

(NOTE: A recipient who decides to enroll as a part-time student must have the approval of the Wilmette Arts Guild Scholarship Selection Committee before payment of the award will be made.)

Scholarship applicants must adhere to the Student Art Show guidelines and instructions.
6. The winner of the Wilmette Arts Guild Fine Art Scholarship will be announced during the **Student Gala Reception**, which will be held at the North Shore Community Bank on Wilmette Ave. on **Tuesday, February 13th**, from 7:00 PM. We urge all applicants and their parents and friends to attend!

The scholarship monies will be paid directly to the college, university or art school that the recipient has chosen to attend.
